- I. Name: Peace Poster Contest Committee**
- II. Purpose:** To provide an Opportunity for Youth to participate in the Lions Clubs International Peace Poster Contest.
- III. Specific Responsibilities:**
- A. To make sure that every Lions club in MD 36 has the information related to participation in the Peace Poster Contest.
 - B. To encourage all Lions clubs to order at least one contest kit.
 - C. To promote the contest among schools, Scouts, 4-H, Boys & Girls Clubs and any other youth groups in the community.
 - D. To make sure that those participating know and follow all of the stated rules in the kits so that no child's poster gets disqualified.
 - E. To make sure the time schedule is followed with no exceptions.
 - F. To ascertain the 1st and 2nd place winners of the MD 36 contest from the Council Chairperson and order the appropriate awards.
- IV. Committee Makeup:**
- A. This committee is made up of a MD Chairperson and the Peace Poster Chairperson from each District in MD 36.
 - B. The District Chairpersons are to be appointed by the District Governors of their respective Districts.
 - C. The MD 36 Chairperson is part of the Opportunities for Youth Committee.
- V. Fiscal Responsibilities:** This committee handles no funds. Any monies necessary would be requested from the Opportunities for Youth Committee.
- VI. Meetings:** There are no regularly scheduled face-to-face meetings. Communication may be done by e-mail or telephone at the beginning of the fiscal year and regularly throughout the contest.
- VII. Reports:**
- A. A report will be submitted quarterly to the Opportunities for Youth Chairperson prior to the Council of Governors (COG) meeting.
 - B. A report will be submitted (orally and/or written as requested by the Council) at all COG meetings.
